Based on the 8th edition of the MLA Handbook

The new MLA 8th edition provides prompts for creating citations. Provide as much of the information as possible in order to cite correctly:

Author.
 Title of source.
 Title of container,
 Other contributors,
 Version,
 Number,
 Publisher,
 Publication date,
 Location.

There is no recommended font, font size or spacing requirements except for the ½ in. hanging indent for citations on the Works Cited page and ½ in. indents on quotes longer than 4 lines. ASK YOUR PROFESSOR FOR ANY FORMATTING REQUIREMENTS.

While MLA 8th does not require double spacing, for purposes of clarity, more than single spacing has been used. The Works Cited page must list the sources in alphabetical order by the last name of the author or editor (by title when there is no author or editor).

Works Cited

When there is no author or editor, use the first major word in the title (in this example, "Climate")
