#### ACADEMIC AND STUDENT AFFAIRS

Dr. Herron reported that the Academic and Student Affairs Committee met on April 11, 2019. The Carl D. Perkins Grant process was discussed and the Audit Report for the College's Perkins grant for period July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, was reviewed. It was noted the audit findings were minor and no return of Perkins grant money is required.
