Members present were Mmes. Carman, Czaya; Messrs. Klegman, Meszaros, Stolzer, Tanzman, and Walsh. Also present were Acting President John Callahan, Mr. Hoffman, Mrs. Widis, and visitors.

Mr. Walsh moved, seconded by Mrs. Czaya, that the Minutes of the regular meeting of July 22 , 1975 , be approved as presented. The motion was unanimously carried.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees appointed the architectural firm of Eckert and Gatarz of North Brunswick, New Jersey on June 24, 1975 for the preparation of plans and specifications for the construction of said parking facilities; and

WHEREAS, the architectural firm of Eckert \& Gatarz has presented its plans and specifications to the Facilities Committee of the lioard of Trustees for review; and

WHEREAS, the Facilities Committee has recommended approval of plans and specifications to the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the plans and specifications for construction of 500 additional parking spaces on the campus be accepted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the architectural firm of Eckert \& Gatarz be authorized to prepare bid specifications for construction of said facilities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vice President for Finance and Controller be authorized to advertise bids for construction of said facilities.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has made application to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare for the acquisition of property known as Building \#229 and adjacent land; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare by letter dated August 12, 1975, has advised Paul Hilf, Vice President for Finance and Controller of the College, that the above noted property has been assigned to Middlesex County College at no cost to the College; and

WHEREAS, the College desires immediate possession of the property and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare has agreed to immediate possession upon the condition that the College accept the terms and conditions set forth in the attached letter; and

WHEREAS, the College officials have reviewed the conditions set forth in the attached letter and are in agreement with same;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. The Board of Trustees hereby agrees to accept the conditions set forth in the attached letter dated August 12, 1975 from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare relating to the immediate acceptance of Building \#229 by the College at no cost to the College.
2. The Board of Trustees authorizes Chairman Joseph Klegman to accept the conditions set forth in said letter and sign any and all documents in order to indicate said acceptance.

Mr. Meszaros moved, seconded by Mr. Stolzer, for adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees appointed Dr. Robert Harris on July 25, 1975; and

WHEREAS, part of the compensation for Dr. Harris was the use of a home located on the campus at 105 Hof Road; and

WHEREAS, a review of the house by the Assistant to the President for Plant Operations and Facility Planning determined that emergency improvements were necessary in order to fulfill the requirements of the contract and to place the premises in livable condition by September 1, 1975; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of this emergency it would be impossible to advertise for bids to purchase all the necessary equipment; and

WHEREAS, no item of equipment will cost in excess of $\$ 2,500$;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Assistant to the President for Plant Operations and Facility Planning and the Vice President for Finance and Controller are authorized to purchase the necessary equipment in order to satisfy the terms of the College's contract with Dr. Harris and place the premises in livable condition with the restriction that no single purchase order exceed the sum of \$2,500; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the total authorization for the emergency renovation not exceed $\$ 16,000$ as appropriated from the uncommitted capital balance as of June 30, 1975.

After discussion, the motion was unanimously carried.

## EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Mrs. Czaya moved, seconded by Mr. Stolzer, that a contract between Middlesex County College and the New Jersey College of Medicine and Dentistry for the use of facilities by students in the Dental Assisting Program, be approved. After discussion, the motion was unanimously carried.

Mrs. Czaya moved, seconded by Mr. Stolzer, for adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Middlesex County College (hereinafter referred to as "Board") and the Department of Institutions and Agencies of the State of New Jersey (hereinafter referred to as 'Department') have entered into a contract for the operation of a child care center for the twelve-month period September 1, 1975 to August 31, 1976; and

WHEREAS, a new proposal has been submitted by the College administration to the Department in the amount of $\$ 116,279.00$, of which seventeen and one-half percent, or $\$ 20,348.82$ will be forthcoming from the respective budget of the Board for the year September 1, 1975 to August 31, 1976; and

WHEREAS, the Department has submitted two contracts to the Board, one contract relating to the transfer of funds by the Board to the Department to enable the Department to sanction the child care center operation, and the other contract relating to the purchase by the Department of day care services from the Middlesex County College; and

WHEREAS, the Board is agreeable to entering into the contracts submitted by the Department with the express understanding that the parties as indicated on Appendix " $B$ " attached to said contracts that the Board will provide supervision and ultimate responsibility for operating the child care center and the Board will be allowed to receive a rental of approximately $\$ 12,000$ for the use of Building S-100 on the College campus; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 18A:64A-12j grants the Board the power to enter into contracts which it deems necessary and advisable with the State or any of its political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that operation of a child care center at the College is consistent with the philosophy and purpose of the College,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. The Board approves the proposal for the operation of the child care center submitted by the administration of Middlesex County College for the period September 1, 1975 to August 31, 1976.
2. The Board authorizes the sum of $\$ 20,348.82$ as the College's share in the operation of the center, plus an additional \$629.34 administrative fee to the Department for a total of $\$ 20,978.16$ to be transferred to the Department pursuant to the agreement between the two parties.
3. The Board authorizes the execution of the two agreements between the Board and the Department, the form of which agreements are attached hereto, with one agreement relating to the transfer of $\$ 20,348.82$ by the Board to the Department in order to operate a child care center at the College, and the other relating to the purchase by the Department from the Board of day care services.
4. The above agreements are executed in accordance with the understanding of the parties as expressed in Appendix " B " to the agreements that the Board will have the responsibility for the operation of the child care center and the Board will receive a rental of approximately $\$ 12,000$ for the use of Building S-100 on the campus by the child care center.
5. The Board authorizes the Chairman and Secretary to execute these contracts.

After discussion, the motion was unanimously carried.
Assistant Vice President Shindelman summarized the July report of the Education Committee. (Copy attached.)

Chairman Klegman requested that the Annual Reports of the Continuing Education Division be distributed to the Board of Trustees.

1. The Board will permit any faculty member who properly advises the President of the College by October 1, 1975 to change his or her tenure option from the three year employment provisions set forth in N.J.S.A.18A:60-1 to the five year employment provision set forth in N.J.S.A. 18A:60-6, et seq.
2. That John Callahan, Vice President for Academic and Student Affairs is to advise any eligible faculty members of this fact as soon as possible.

SUBJECT: August Report to the Education Committee

1. A GUIDE TO VOLUNTARY COMPLIANCE WITH OSHA - Content: An introduction to OSHA, safety and heal th standards, and safety programming.
2. INDUSTRIAL HEALTH HAZARDS - Content: This one-day seminar focused on the source, effect, measurement and control of various occupational health hazards. Solid, liquid and gaseous agents were discussed as well as radiation, vibration and noise, and the problems arising from occupational exposure to them. Special emphasis was placed on compliance with OSHA standards and specific protective equipment was displayed and demonstrated.
3. The following are the credit-free, self-interest mini-courses designed to meet the needs of the community. These were included in the offerings for summer, 1975:
A. KEYPUNCH - Content: A concentrated course designed to prepare the participant for employment as a keypunch operator upon successful completion. This program provided continuous hands -on experience with IBM 029 keypunch machines with stress on accuracy and work volume.
B. KARATE CAMP - Content: A camp for young people between the ages of 13 and 17 years that involved intensive fundamental training in basic karate techniques.
C. TENNIS CAMP - Content: Covered the basic skills and techniques for beginning and intermediate tennis players between the ages of 8 and 16 years. Top instruction, the use of videotape replay and ball machines were provide during instruction. Skills covered were the forehand drive, backhand drive, serve, volley, and overhead smash.
D. INTERMEDIATE MIDDLE EASTERN DANCE - Content: A continuation of Middle Eastern Dance, participants learned to exercise their bodies in twisting, shimmying and rolling movements. Advancement to more complex movements was included as well as continued gain in self confidence.
E. WRESTLING CLINIC - Content: Developed the totally well-rounded matman, covered the specific areas of takedown and takedown defense, escapes and reversals, breakdowns and pinning combinations, leg usage, and leg defense. Also more general areas included conditioning and psychological motivation.
