Minutes of July 28, 1999 Meeting

WHEREAS, DKD Construction, Inc., the apparent second low bidder, failed to submit a list of its subcontractors until after the bids were opened contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.25; and

WHEREAS, GRE Construction, the apparent third low bidder, failed to submit a bid bond in the requisite amount pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:64A-25.16 until after the bids were opened; and

WHEREAS, the other bidders have submitted bids in a substantially higher sums; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is in the best interests of the College to reject all bids and advertise for new bids,

Subject: President's Report – July, 1999

First an update on the search for a new Vice President for Finance. The Screening Committee carefully reviewed the credentials of the 54 applicants and identified nine individuals to be invited in for an interview. One of the invitees declined the invitation when he learned that a substantial salary increase from his present position was not likely. Accordingly, eight interviews were scheduled for July 20 and 21, but only seven were conducted as one of the candidates became hospitalized on the day of his interview.

After the interviews the committee agreed that three individuals should be given further consideration. Those candidates will be invited back to meet with (1) the Executive Council, (2) the staff of the Finance Division, (3) Vice President Trickel and me, and finally, (4) with me. In general we were impressed with the qualifications and presentations of all three finalists and I am optimistic that we will fill a critical position at the College with a very well qualified individual.

During the early part of the Spring, 1999 semester the College employed a consultant to perform a comprehensive health, safety and fire safety audit. The results of that audit were presented to the Facilities Committee on June 23. Many of the consultant's recommendations have been addressed and the remainder are under review by the appropriate member of the Executive Council, so that priorities can be established. One of the study's key recommendations was the establishment of a college wide safety committee. I am pleased to report that Dr. Diane Trainor, a senior faculty member who has considerable expertise in industrial health and safety, has agreed to chair the committee. Dr. Trainor and I met in July and developed the committee charge and the membership profile. We expect by the end of September, the College Wide Safety Committee will be up and running.
